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**MR BOLDEROW WRITES:**

As you may have read in the press, the group Extinction Rebellion are planning two weeks of action in London. They will be shutting two bridges, Westminster and Lambeth, and also closing a number of roads in Westminster. A map can be found on their [website](#) of the roads they intend to close but this is likely to be a protest that changes locations over the course of the two weeks. Please ensure you son leaves plenty of time for his journey to school as there is likely to be congestion on the roads and impacts on public transport; some boys may have to adapt their route so the TfL website should be checked for updates.

Last year, for the environmental protests led by and aimed at young people, I supported the small number of boys who wished to attend provided they were accompanied if under 16. The nature of these protests is different and the School will not grant permission to attend the demonstrations.
